- ◆ The TN Yellow Dot Program, a tool that TN law enforcement and first responders look for on vehicles when they encounter individuals in need of medical assistance.
- ◆ Reminders about Elder Care actions.

Austin Peltzer is with Veterans Healthcare (a MOAA affinity partner), where he focuses on educational outreach for veterans, military retirees, and their families. He works with Medicare beneficiaries who have Medicare Part A and Part B and may also have TRICARE For Life, VA benefits, CHAMPVA, or a combination of these coverages. His presentation will focus on education and awareness, helping beneficiaries better understand how Medicare Advantage plans may work alongside their existing coverage and what additional benefits may be available, including dental, vision, hearing, and Part B premium givebacks, at no additional cost depending on eligibility and plan availability.

Here are two community opportunities for your calendar: On 25 September, MTC MOAA will conduct ‘Operation Commissary’ at OSDTN. In December (date TBD) MTC MOAA will be handing out Publix gift cards at OSDTN to needy veterans and active-duty families, using a \$2K grant.

For awareness, there’s a local fundraiser to support Women Veterans. A Franklin photographer (Misty Westebbe) is taking portraits of Women Veterans and assembling a coffee book that will pair a portrait and personal story. The goal is to complete the book for Veterans Day, 2027. A suggested tax-deductible donation per portrait session is \$190. However, no woman veteran will be turned away, the donation request will be waived if the veteran is unable to afford it. Each woman veteran who participates will be presented with a portrait of their choice. The proceeds from the portraits and book sales will support a local horse farm (Hold Your Horses Farm TN) in Christiana that supports Women Veterans through equine-assisted services. Legislative Update

The June issue of *Military Officer* magazine, pages 22-23, shows a photo of the 260 visitors plus the 4 senior leaders of MOAA who traveled from all over the country to visit our Congress members in April for the annual Advocacy-in-Action Week (AiA). Three were from Tennessee. Together we visited over 300 offices to speak about MOAA’s four primary initiatives for 2026. We spoke with senators and representatives and very often with their senior advisors.

Whence cometh these 100 senators and 435 representatives? They are those who prevailed through the process of primary elections and then the general election to follow. It all begins with participating voters.

Middle Tennessee Chapter meets most commonly in Williamson County and occasionally in Davidson County, and our members live in several counties each with their own statistics. Looking at just Williamson, with almost 190,000 registered voters, just under 14% voted in the recent primary. All representatives and 1/3 of senators are up for election this year, and will turnout for those primaries be stronger than 14%? So few are speaking for so many!

Our chapter is very strong with AiA letter writing – apparently the strongest in Tennessee. That is all fine, but it is worth remembering that we can only write to those who got elected. Elections matter. The candidates available to us in November will be those who won the primaries in August. There is no significance in writing to those who did not prevail in the elections, so having future impact through AiA depends on educating those who will later support MOAA initiatives for those serving and veterans.

The upcoming primary election day is August 6th, and early voting dates will be available in July. That process is coming up soon, and the realigning of the 9 Tennessee districts will impact many of us. It is worthwhile checking soon which district you reside in and then who the aspiring candidates will be competing for your attention, support, and vote.

The situation is confusing right now, so it is worthwhile to do your homework and prepare. Also, remember that your current congressional district and elected representative will continue to serve you until next January 3rd when the new congress is sworn in. For right now, prepare for your primary election.

Our MOAA culture is explicitly non-partisan as our MOAA initiatives are also – worth remembering that. It is thoroughly non-partisan to remind us to be aware of the process, the schedule, and the importance of our participating in it.
